AMY E. MOSES SELECTED TO SERVE AS U.S. MAGISTRATE JUDGE FOR THE DISTRICT OF RHODE ISLAND



The United States District Court for the District of Rhode Island is pleased to announce the selection of Amy E. Moses as a full-time U.S. Magistrate Judge. Ms. Moses will assume the role upon the retirement of the Honorable Lincoln D. Almond in May 2025.

Ms. Moses brings an impressive breadth of legal experience to the bench, with a career spanning two decades in both public service and private practice. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree from the University of California, Berkeley in 1997, and her Juris Doctor from The George Washington University Law School in 2004.

Ms. Moses began her legal career as a Law Clerk in the Rhode Island Supreme Court Law Clerk Department in 2004 and subsequently served as a Law Clerk for the Honorable William E. Smith of the U.S. District Court for the District of Rhode Island in 2005. She then joined Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom, LLP, where she worked as a litigation associate from 2006 to 2010.

In 2011, Ms. Moses returned to the U.S. District Court for the District of Rhode Island as a Law Clerk for the Honorable John J. McConnell, Jr., a position she held until 2015. Following her clerkship, she joined the Office of the Governor for then-Governor Gina M. Raimondo, serving as Deputy Counsel through 2017. She then served as Vice President and Rhode Island Director for Conservation Law Foundation from 2017 to 2021. Most recently, Ms. Moses has served as General Counsel for Utilidata, Inc., a Rhode Island-based energy technology company, since 2021.

Chief Judge John J. McConnell, Jr. praised Ms. Moses' appointment, stating, "Amy's extensive legal expertise, her dedication to public service, and her diverse professional background make her an exceptional choice to serve as a U.S. Magistrate Judge. We are confident she will continue to uphold the highest standards of justice and fairness in our District."

A magistrate judge is a judicial officer of the district court and is appointed by majority vote of the active district judges of the court to exercise jurisdiction over matters assigned by statute as well as those delegated by the district judges. They serve an eight-year term.
