This Merit Selection Panel shall review the performance of Magistrate Judge Lincoln D. Almond and Magistrate Judge Patricia A. Sullivan, comments received in response to the public notice, and the operations of each of their offices during their terms as United States Magistrate Judges.

The Merit Selection Panel may interview Magistrate Judges Lincoln D. Almond and Magistrate Judge Patricia A. Sullivan, and submit to this Court no later than March 9, 2020, a written report recommending whether Magistrate Judge Lincoln D. Almond and Magistrate Judge Patricia A. Sullivan should be reappointed to an additional term of office and any suggested changes which should be made for the improvement of operations of the Court in which they preside.

Merit Selection Panel members have been advised in writing of the restriction set forth in §420.30.20(d) of the Regulations of the Judicial Conference of the United States Establishing Standards and Procedures for the Appointment and Reappointment of United States Magistrate Judges.
