NOTICE REGARDING THE ELECTRONIC PAYMENT OF FEES FOR NOTICES OF APPEAL IN CRIMINAL CASES

The United States District Court for the District of Rhode Island now accepts online credit card payments via Pay.gov from registered CM/ECF Filing Users for notices of appeal filed in criminal cases. When electronically filing a notice of appeal in a criminal case, the Filing User, if required to pay the filing fee, will automatically be directed to the Pay.gov online payment process. Upon successful completion of the online payment, the Filing User will automatically return to CM/ECF to complete the filing. Pay.gov is a secure web-based application operated by the U.S. Treasury Department, which allows users to submit payments to government agencies electronically.

A party who was permitted to proceed with court appointed counsel in the District Court may proceed on appeal *in forma pauperis* without further authorization, unless the District Court certifies that the appeal is not taken in good faith or finds that the party is not otherwise entitled to proceed *in forma pauperis*. See: Fed. R. App. P. 24(a)(3).

Counsel are reminded that an attorney who has represented a defendant in a criminal case in the District Court will be responsible for representing the defendant on appeal, whether or not the attorney has entered an appearance in the Court of Appeals, until the attorney is relieved of such duty by the Court of Appeals.
